Energy Efficient Buildings European Initiative



The construction industry has a clear responsibility

- Buildings are responsible for 40% of total European Energy Consumption
- The building sector must reduce energy consumption by 20% by 2020
- Renewable Energy Sources will have to provide a 20% energy share by 2020

The scale of change needed in the building sector is huge. Your active participation in developing an industry response is vital.

What is the E2B Initiative?

An International not-for-profit Industry Association, Energy Efficient Buildings Association (E2B A) has been created to launch a European wide Initiative in the area of Energy Efficient Buildings (E2B EI).

This European Initiative is aiming at creating longterm coporation with the European Commision, resulting in an industry led Public Private Partnership (PPP). This is initially being carried out within the EeB, PPP launched within the framework of the European Economic recovery plan, as first step of a longer term and even more ambitious strategy, well coordinated with national and regional governments to acheive a large impact and engage and vast community of public and private stakeholders.

The budget of the E2B EI is 2bn over the next 10 years.

The overall objective of E2B EI is to deliver, implement and optimise concepts that have the technical, economic and social potential to drastically reduce the energy consumption and decrease CO₂ emissions in the European Union.

E2B Association (E2B A) will seek to implement the ECTP strategy on energy efficient buildings and districts.

How will the E2B EI be different from other European programmes?

- Existing mechanisms do not have the **scale** to address the ambitious EU targets on GHG emissions and energy efficiency
- The PPP will cover the whole **supply chain** while researching sustainable business models for R&D implementation
- The PPP will **seek long-term** financing, construction and maintenance of energy efficient buildings and districts
- The PPP will maintain strong **connections** with other European Technology Platform (ETPs) and coordinate EU and national initiatives

What is the link with the European Construction Technology Platform (ECTP) and other ETP's?

Deliverable of the ECTP Strategic Research Agenda and its Implementation Action Plan, is a proposition for the creation of a PPP on Energy Efficient Buildings.

Join key industry players in this ambitious EU-wide initiative to set directions and speed up innovation.

Contribute to the transformation of the construction from a resource-intensive to a knowledge-intensive industry.

Contribute to the EU 2020 targets cut GHG emissions by 20%, 20% renewable energy in energy mix and 20% reduction on energy consumption.

Lead the development of sustainable high-added-value technologies, products and services.

In Order to achieve our goal we need multidisciplinary contributions from outside the construction sector, mobilising further stakeholders and inputs from relevant European initiatives such as ETP's and JTI's.

What are the benefits?

There are a variety of benefits for a range of stakeholders from large companies to SME's Universities and RTO's. Some of these include:

- Leverage 100% of R&D investment on related projects and access large-scale funding programmes and markets
- Strengthen competitiveness
- Influence the EU R&D agenda to set up a continuous research programme
- Take advantage of specific measures for SME assistance including development
- Connect with a wide range of academic disciplines
- Maintain long-term industry engagement
